

Summary Report of the City Council meeting held August 13, 2018

1. Girl Scout Troop 106012 presented to Council the Lending Library Program.
2. Department Heads reported on monthly activity.
3. City Council approved a resolution casting a vote for Joe Sherwin to be appointed to the San Jacinto River Authority (SJRA) Groundwater Reduction Planning (GRP) review Committee.
4. City Council approved the first amendment to the Waste Management Solid Waste Agreement authorizing a one-time increase in monthly base rate by eighty nine cents (.89).
5. City Council continuation of TMLIRP coverage for property, liability and workers compensation coverage.
6. City Council approved two (2) budget amendments to move money to offset increases regarding full time salaries and administrative support and miscellaneous expenses.
7. City Council accepted Chief of Police's retirement letter and named Lieutenant Tom Libby as Police Chief-elect for the transition period.
8. City Council accepted the Comment 2018-01 from the Capital Improvement Advisory committee (CIAC) recommending no change to the City's impact fees for water and wastewater improvements.
9. City Council approved a resolution regarding changes in the schedule of fees, changes included:
 - 9.1. Adding swim lesson costs
 - 9.2. Increasing baseball field rentals
 - 9.3. Increasing additional trash receptacles (as per Waste Management fee)
10. City Council approved a proposal from RPS regarding Right-of-Way acquisition services for Robinson Road.
11. City Council approved a plat for commercial subdivision of 1.7933 acres creating one reserve, one block and one restricted Reserve A.
12. City Council held a public hearing and approved Order No. 2018-01 allowing for thirty (30) days for the property owner at 27202 Blueberry Hill to clean up the necessary nuisances in order to be compliant with the City.
13. City Council held a public hearing and approved Order No. 2018-02 allowing for thirty (30) days for the property owner at 27270 Paula Lane to clean up the necessary nuisances in order to be compliant with the City.
14. City Council adjourned into executive session but no action was taken as a result of the executive session.
